THE AMERICAN PEOPLE WANT TO REIN IN CORPORATE MONOPOLIES

A series of surveys newly released by Fight Corporate Monopolies and Grow Progress shows Americans overwhelmingly see big corporations as harmful to our economy and believe Washington should act to rein-in monopolies.

Fight Corporate Monopolies x Grow Progress surveys of American adults weighted for age, race, and gender found:

- 58% of Americans, including 70% of people with a High School education or less, agree that **"Big corporations hurt Americans."**
- 87% of Americans, including 81% of people identifying as moderate, agree that **"Big corporations have too much power."**
- 77% of Americans, including 80% of people making \$49,000 or less, agree that **"Elected officials must act to prevent big corporations from hurting Americans."**

The surveys were conducted by Grow Progress on November 21, 2021 with an audience of 2,401 adults, balanced on age, race, and gender in the United States and weighting for age, race, gender, education, and party.

Fight Corporate Monopolies and Grow Progress also asked respondents about longer messages, and found similar high levels of agreement and enthusiasm for checking the power of big corporations:

- 79% of 1,621 respondents believe "My costs - like groceries, rent, and gas - go up every year because just a few big corporations control the market and drive up prices. Elected officials allow them to get away with it."
- 75% of 1,006 respondents agreed "elected officials have the ability to rein in the power of big corporations" and "should be responsible for reining in the power of big corporations".
